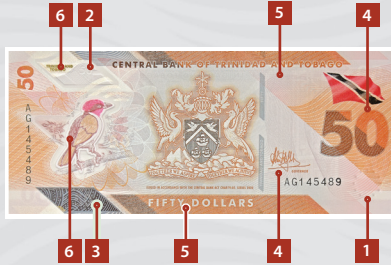
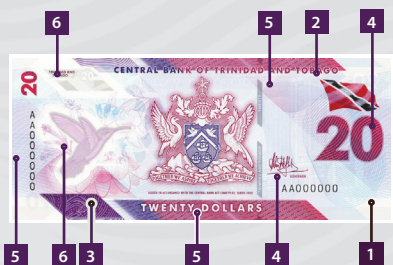
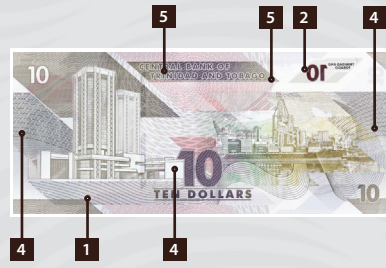
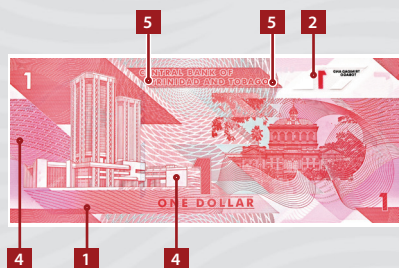


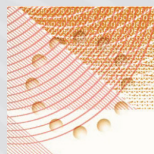
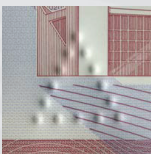
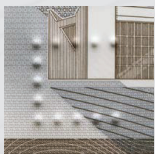
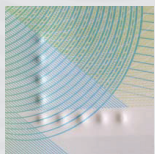
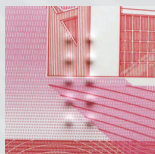
POLYMER BANKNOTES



FEEL

Polymer notes feel smoother than paper.

- 1 Run your fingers over the bottom corner of the note to feel raised dots in a particular shape, unique to each note; "two lines", "L", "C", "triangle" shape, "circle" shape and the "X".



LOOK



When you hold the note up to the light you will see:

- 2 A clear window that can be seen from the front and back of the note.
- 3 The numeral 1, 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 appearing in the coloured print.

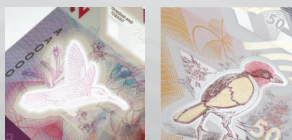
CHECK



Using an ultra-violet (UV) light and a magnifier:

- 4 If you look at the note under UV light you will see that some areas of the note glow.
- 5 If you look at the note under magnification, some areas that appear as plain print are in fact very small letters and numbers.

TILT



As you move the note around you will see:

- 6 Areas with a shimmering coloured ink.
