



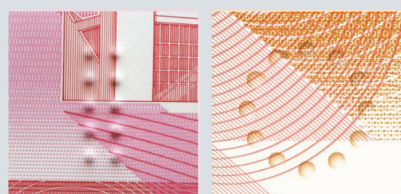

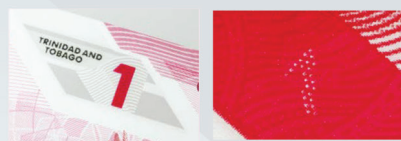
INTRODUCTION OF \$1 AND UPDATED \$50 POLYMER NOTES

The Central Bank of Trinidad and Tobago announces the introduction of a new \$1 polymer note and an updated \$50 polymer note, as legal tender from February 15, 2021. The existing \$1 cotton notes and the \$50 cotton and polymer notes will continue to be legal tender until further notice.



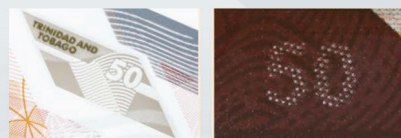
1 FEEL

Polymer notes feel smoother than paper. Run your fingers over the bottom corner of the note to feel the shape.

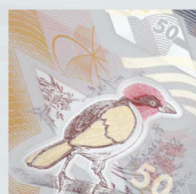


2 LOOK

When you hold the note up to the light you will see the denomination of the note appearing in the coloured print.



Clear Window — Hold the note up to the light to reveal the see-through window completely integrated and visible from both sides of the note. The value of the note is printed clearly in white inside the window and visible from both sides.



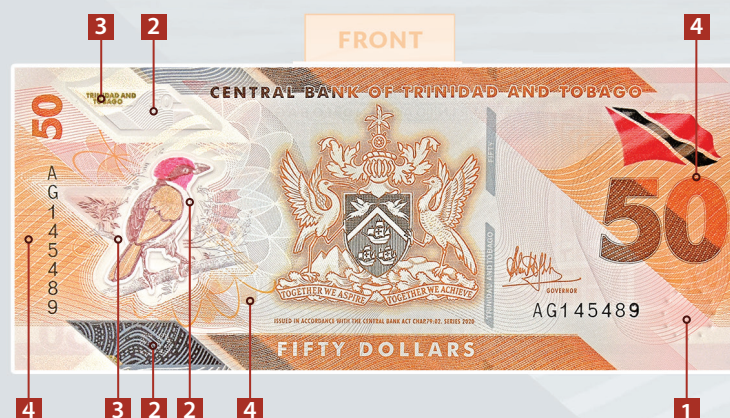
3 TILT

As you move the note around you will see areas with a shimmering coloured ink.



4 CHECK

Using an ultra-violet (UV) light and a magnifier you will see that some areas of the glow. When the notes are looked at under magnification, you will see that some areas that appear as plain print are in fact small letters and numbers.
