Instructions for submitting photography

1. The virtual exhibition is open to all ages.
2. The exhibition is open to all nationals and residents of Trinidad and Tobago, whether based in the country at the moment or abroad.
3. You may submit a maximum of three (3) photographs based on the theme of this year's IMD.
4. Photographs can be new or ones previously taken. If submitting photographs previously taken they must not have been published elsewhere either in print or virtually.
5. The Bank reserves the right to select works and curate the show as it sees fit.
6. The deadline for submission of photographs is **Sunday, May 10, 2020 at 12:00 midnight EST.**
7. All submissions must be in .jpeg format with a file size between 1MB - 5MB
8. Photographs must be submitted via We Transfer or Dropbox link to museum@central-bank.org.tt. Submissions should not have any borders, signatures or watermarks and the file name should be the title of the piece (e.g. Sunset.jpeg). Please also include a contact number.
9. In the email please include a 300-word (maximum) brief that discusses the photograph as well as a 150-word (maximum) biography of yourself.
10. Photographs will be reviewed and selected for the virtual exhibition and entrants informed of their successful inclusion via email by **Thursday, May 14, 2020.**

The exhibition will be launched on the Central Bank's website and social media pages (Instagram and Facebook) on Monday, May 18, 2020
